Trip Updates

- May 19, 2013 I summited Mt Everest today, May 19th at 7:00 am and took some beautiful pictures
 and a video with the Focus flag! Take care and greetings to the entire team from the Top of the
 World!!! Horacio
- May 17, 2013 I am in Camp 3 at 7,300 meters on my way to the summit. Summit day is May 18th if
 weather holds! (Soon after came:) At camp 4 with terrible wind, more than 100k ... At 8,000 meters.

- May 6, 2013 Listen to update from everest!

We have established Camp 3 at 7,300 meters, also sleeping there without supplemental oxygen. Now, we are resting for a few days at Base Camp, waiting for a weather window that will allow us to start the final summit push. Summit days have been targeted around May 15 to 20, if the windspeed decreases compared with current values. The jetstream is still around the summit.

April 29, 2013 - In 6 hours to establish Camp 3 at 7,300 meters. Next day will descend to Camp 2
and the following day to Base Camp to recover Very cold and windy here, - 35 C every day and
strong winds ... Got Khumbu cough so I need a few days to recover ... Other than that everything is
ok! Take care - H from 6,500 meters. See <u>Horacio's location</u>

- April 23, 2013 I am at Base Camp now, waiting for the weather. In few days we will try to establish
 Camp 3 at 7,300 meters. We have climbed thru the Khumbu Icefall, between Base Camp and Camp
 1 and then to Camp 2 at 6,500 meters. The Icefall is amazing, spectacular but dangerous place.
 Everything going well so far, take care guys. Thank you.
- April 19, 2013 Listen to update from everest!
- April 15, 2013 We are at Everest Base Camp and climbing across the Icefall to camp 1 in 3 days.
 Very cold so far ! E... See <u>Horacio's Iocation (http://dlor.me/T5D7CRB)</u>
- April 8, 2013 We are in Khumjung and in the following 5 days will be trekking to Tyngboche,
 Dyngboche and Lobuche. Finally we will reach the small village of Gorak Shep and the next day
 Everest Base Camp at 5,500 meters. Internet access is very limited so we will update once we reach base camp.
- April 5, 2013 We went to the Khumjung School and Khunde Hospital today for an acclimatization trek. Amazing place and culture! We are entering more and more into the Himalayas.

Environmental Goals

As part of this trip we have set some environmental goals; we are hiring extra Sherpa to bring back old garbage and oxygen bottles that have been abandoned high on Everest during the early years of exploration. We will also leave laptop computers, some books and toothbrushes at the Kunde Hospital, near the Everest Base Camp, at almost 5,000 meters.

- April 4, 2013 We arrived at Namche Bazar a few hours ago. Amazing place and culture! We are
 entering more and more into the Himalayas. We flew to Lukla and then walked for 3 hours to
 Phakding yesterday. The landing in Lukla was not for the faint of heart ... Everything is going well,
 good weather so far! We are hydrating and eating to recover from our 6 hour steep hike to
 Namche
- March 31, 2013 We are in Kathmandu after a stop in Honk Kong for a press conference and jet lag adjustment ...
- Kathmandu is our base for the next couple of days and we are registering permits and doing last minute equipment checks, buying gas and some extra food and gear.
- January 20, 2013 Just a quick update to tell everyone that I am back in Canada after a successful
 climb, where I summited Mt Aconcagua (7,000 meters highest peak in the Americas) twice
 (January 9 and January 14 from base camp) as part of my Everest training. Everything went well
 and I have 10 fingers and 10 toes ... which is good, considering the temperatures on the second
 summit push.
