A native of Mendoza, Argentina, mountaineering is in Horacio Cunietti's blood. Professor of Mountaineering and professional High Altitude Mountain Guide, Horacio has made more than 120 high altitude summits around the world – including 57 of his local 7,000-metre peak, Mount Aconcagua. In 2012, he set a world record for the most summits of Aconcagua, and is also the first to have completely circumnavigated the mountain.

He's also biked 500km across the Andes mountain range, and run the grueling Canadian Deception Pass Race – a 125km ultra-marathon in the Rocky Mountains.
